The course has links to The Intercultural Theatre Institute in Singapore. When places are available, BPA Honours students can apply to spend an intensive training period at ITI Singapore.

Who can apply?

The Performance Making stream is open to students with an undergraduate degree specialisation in any of these areas:

- Acting or Performance-making graduates who want to make original work either independently or in collaboration with others as a performer-maker or director-maker or dramaturgy;
- Design (set, costume, lighting, sound or performance art/installation)
- Playwriting or Creative Writing graduates
- Arts management or stage management graduates who want to move into 'Creative Producing'
- Dance graduates who want to choreograph or direct

- Creative Practice labs with WAAPA staff and guests
- Incubation time to make new work with the guidance of WAAPA staff and guest mentors
- Studio presentations at key milestones
- A chance to pursue an independent research topic with guidance of expert staff
- Opportunity for international study tour to Singapore with Intercultural Training Institute

A digital submission presenting past or current work (Due 28 November) and followed by an online interview for shortlisted candidates (online on 12th-15th December 2022).

For Dance

In person auditions will take place in Melbourne 5 October and in Perth 5 December

Please Note:

The digital submission/interview requirement may be waived for current ECU students enrolled in the Bachelor of Performing Arts or Bachelor of Arts (Dance) at the discretion of the Course Coordinator.

There are also minimum English language requirements to be met.
